

Creating a Bird-Friendly Yard Tuesday, May 14 @ 6:00pm to 7:00pm In Community Room 2



Accessibility Services

The Community Library of DeWitt & Jamesville is committed to providing equal access to all patrons, including those with disabilities. Services include, but are not limited to: home delivery and outreach for homebound patrons; assistive technologies such as ZoomText and open captioning; large print and audio materials; and library social stories for children ages 3 & up. Home Delivery for Homebound Patrons

The CLD&I offers free Home Delivery Service for eligible individuals residing in the CLD&I's service area, which encompasses the Jamesville-DeWitt school district. Deliveries are made on a monthly basis. The program is for individuals with a valid Onondága County Public Library Card who meet the following criteria: senior citizen non-drivers; and donate blood to ensure cancer, surgical, trauma and those with long term illnesses or disabilities unable to so many other types of patient needs are met.
