## **2024 Library Budget Proposition**

In January 2024, the Board of Trustees for the Community Library of DeWitt & Jamesville unanimously approved the 2024 Budget Proposition for an increase of \$36,661, or only 2% over the 2023 tax levy.

This very modest increase will be used to support increased operating expenses and continue our outreach, programming, and library services and collections.

# New Mobile Printing Service

• With our mobile printing service, you can use your personal computer or mobile device to print to the Library's printer from anywhere.

Simply submit documents for printing and come to the Library to release and pick up your document. The Library offers black and white and color printing. Black and white is

.15¢ per page and color is .25¢ per page.

# How to print from a desktop or mobile device:

- Begin by visiting <a href="https://print.princh.com">https://print.princh.com</a> and entering our printer ID: 106834
- Click to select and upload a file. You can upload multiple files.
- Confirm your settings. Select B&W or Color and enter the number of copies you would like.
- The Settings gear icon has additional options, including choosing page range and seeing a preview of your print.

- Enter your email address and click "OK."

- When the print job says Ready, click "Done" or "Print another document."
- At the print release station on the library's lower level, select "Release a Print Job."
- Enter the email address you supplied in the second box and select your print job.
- Put cash in the coin machine to pay for your job and select "Pay from Vending Device."
   Print jobs totaling \$3 or more can be paid with a card by asking staff.
- Your print job will be printed!

# ESOL Bookpack Collection

Thanks to an Adult Literacy and Workforce Development Mini-Grant, the Community Library of DeWitt & Jamesville has added materials to our collection for English Speakers of Other Languages.

Known as Bookpacks, these items consist of a book by a popular adult author such as James Patterson, Nora Roberts, and Suzanne Collins, and an audio recording of the book. They require use of headphones, but do not need a CD player. The Bookpacks augment the packs already in the collection, children's chapter books. Adding age appropriate materials helps affirm the dignity of our adult English Learners.

These items help the Library provide quality service to area residents, meeting their educational and cultural needs. Listening to a text while reading along aids in the comprehension and acquisition of any new language. When the texts are interesting and read by area natives, this leads to discussion opportunities and a greater sense of community. The CLD&J is glad to support our English learners in their transition to live in Central New York.
