

Will you tell us a little about your children's book?

The Peddler's Bed (published by Ripple Grove Press) is velopment. Most recently, I completed one about a child about a peddler who comes across an old man at work in his garden. He tries to sell him a fine, hand-crafted bed, guaranteed to never squeak. But the man has no money. So the peddler makes a bargain with him-if he can think of a way to make the bed squeak, he may have the bed. Does he win the bed? You'll have to read the book to find out. The illustrator, Bong Redila, did a fabulous job bringing the story to life through bright, colorful illustrations that Kirkus Reviews likened to stained glass.

What other children's stories have you written?

My second book is The Dinosaur Tag Survival Guide. It's a "serious" rule book for kids who plan to play tag with a dinosaur. The book will be available soon via MeeGenius, a digital children's book publisher that offers hundreds of picture eBooks via the MeeGenius app. The book will be illustrated by artist Ruben Carral.

What interests you about writing picture books?

I decided to write picture books because I love everything about them: the delightful stories, the fantastic artwork, the smell of the paper, the feel of the cover and the pages, and the fond memories they elicit from childhood. My love for picture books, combined with my love for writing, fueled my desire to write my own picture book stories. And if my books can spark something in a child, whether it is an inter-




I have several picture book stories in various stages of dewho is bullied because she has big feet. And I am working on one about a miniature horse in the circus who dreams about being a cross country race horse and another one about the life cycle of a butterfly.

Where can people go to learn more about you and your books?

I have a blog called Frog On A Blog (www.frogonablog.net) that is all about children's picture books. I include a weekly feature "Picture Books At The Library", where I list some of the newest titles the Library has in its collection. People can also find me on Facebook, Twitter, and GoodReads.

The Peddler's Bed is available for checkout at the Library and for purchase through Amazon, Barnes & Noble, and independent bookstores.

If you see Lauri at the Library, say "hi" and ask her about The Peddler's Bed and other stories she's been working on. Then join Lauri at the Library on Saturday, Sept. 19 from 11-12:30. She'll be throwing a launch party to celebrate the release of The Peddler's Bed. She'll be reading the book, making crafts with kids, and signing books. Thanks to Barnes & Noble, a percentage of book sales will go to benefit the Library. There will also be refreshments available.
